What is a Dasvandh Box?

A Dasvandh Box is a little box with a big meaning. It is meant to show the importance of giving back to others and that every little bit counts. By raising just a few pennies at a time, collectively, your Khalsa School can make a big difference!

The Dasvandh Box Initiative is a program that consists of a lesson plan on Dasvandh, as well as an 7 week trial of giving Dasvandh.

This program is designed to:

- ★ educate our Sikh children on the meaning of Dasvandh
- ★ be a rewarding experience in learning about the importance of seva
- ★ encourage leadership
- ★ be easy to participate in
- ★ remind parents and children to inspire the act and spirit of Dasvandh
